Notes to the Financial Results for the Half-Year ended 31st March 2020

- 1 The Financial Results have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Standards as notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act 2013 ("Act"), read there under and other accounting principles generally accepted in India as amended from time to time.
- 2 The above Financial Results and Statement of Assets and Liabilities were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on June 15th, 2020
- 3 The company doesnot have separate reportable segments as per the Accounting Standard 17 on "Segment Reporting" notified under Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2014.
- 4 Figures of previous year/ period have been regrouped/recast whereever necessary, in order to make them comparable.
- During the half year the company has issued and alloted bonus shares to the existing shareholders, in proportion of 1(one) equity share as bonus shares for every 6 (six) equity share held. The total bonus shares 14,49,152 (Fourteen Lakhs forty nine thousand one hundred and fifty two only) amounting to Rs. 1,44,91,520 (One Crores forty four lakhs ninety one thousand five hundred and twenty only) were issued.

The number of equity shares outstanding before the bonus issue is adjusted for the proportionate change in the number of equity shares outstanding as if the event had occurred at the beginning of the earliest period reported.

7 Estimation uncertainty relating to the global health pandemic on COVID-I9

The management has considered the possible effects, if any, that may result from the pandemic relating to COVID - 19 on the carrying amounts of trade receivables & inventories. In assessing the recoverability of receivables, the Company has considered internal and external information upto the date of approval of these financial results including credit reports and economic forecasts. The Company has performed sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current indicators of future economic conditions, the Company expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. The impact of the global health pandemic may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial results and the Company will continue to closely monitor any material changes and future economic conditions.

8 As on March 31st, 2020, the Company was listed on NSE Emerge (SME Platform) accordingly the financial results as on March 31st,2020 have been submitted in the format applicable to NSE Emerge. INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON AUDIT OF HALFYEAR AND ANNUAL FINANCIAL RESULTS

TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF KAPSTON FACILITIES MANAGEMENT LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Half yearly financial results of **KAPSTON FACILITIES MANAGEMENT LIMITED** (the company) for the half year ended 31st March, 2020 and the year to date results for the period from 1st April, 2019 to 31st March, 2020, attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these financial results:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net profit and other financial information for the half year ended 31st March, 2020 and the year to date results for the period from 1st April, 2019 to 31st March, 2020

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Results section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial results under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of these financial results that give a true and fair view of the net profit/loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Accounting Standard 25, 'Interim Financial Reporting' prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued there under and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Results for the half year and year ended 31st March, 2020

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial results.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:
